2018-2019 State Accountability Results – JCPS

Transition Readiness:

- The percentage of students transition ready increased from 49.8 in 2018 to 53.0 in 2019.
- Eight high schools showed double-digit gain in transition readiness rates (including bonus) Butler (11.5%), Fern Creek (10.6%), Jeffersontown (10.8%), Moore (18.2%), PRP (11.2%), Valley (15.4%), Waggener (10.4%), and Western HS (12.9%).
- All of these schools, with the exception of Butler, are Academies of Louisville.

Graduation Rate:

- The four-year graduation rate increased from 81.6% to an all-time high of 82.3%.
- 11 high schools increased their four-year graduation rate (Brown and Manual reached 100%).
- Iroquois high school increased by 11 percentage points in one year.

Proficiency:

- Overall, proficiency rates declined slightly from last year (1-3%) across the content areas.
- 22 schools 15 ES, 2 MS, 5 HS improved their proficiency rates in both reading and math

Gap:

- Fewer significant gaps identified, signaling initial positive impacts of the racial equity pillar.
- 62 of 64 schools exited Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI).
- Twelve of 136 schools showed a significant gap for African American students (9%)

Overall Classifications:

- Nine of 21 schools exited CSI status and proactive support was provided to several of the new CSI with the AIS support structure.
- 23 new schools were identified as CSI for a total of 35 CSI schools (24 ES, 7, MS, 4 HS).
- JCPS received a 2-star rating at the elementary, middle, and high school levels.
- Seven schools received 5-star ratings: Brown ES, Greathouse, Lowe, Norton, Barret, Brown MS, Manual. Six schools (4%) received 4-star ratings: Audubon, Bowen, Norton Commons, Wheeler, Brown HS, Male.
- 49 schools (35%) received a 1-star rating (62% at HS level)
- Seven schools received "high or very high" ratings in all areas: Audubon, Bowen, Norton Commons, St. Matthews, Tully, Brown HS, Manual. 56 schools received "low or very low" ratings in all areas (30 ES, 13 MS, 13, HS).

Areas of Growth:

- Increase focus on acceleration plans using MAP data to increase proficiency rates
- Continue efforts to eliminate the achievement gap (9 schools reduced their star ratings due to significant gaps in student groups)
- Enhance support for additional CSI schools
- Implement laser-like focus on deep implementation of three pillars and six instructional systems in every school
