**Deliberate Disruption - Minor**  
Description: Behavior that impacts the student or staff near them. Examples include refusal to follow directions, scowling, slamming/ dropping books, inappropriate language

**Deliberate Disruption - Moderate**  
Description: Behavior that impacts educational environment/common area. Examples include throwing objects, yelling, etc.

**Deliberate Disruption - Significant**  
Description: Behavior that causes /threatens emotional or physical harm

<b>Theft</b> - A person is guilty of theft by unlawful taking or disposition when he unlawfully: (a) Takes or exercises control over movable property of another with intent to deprive him thereof; or (b) Obtains immovable property of another or any interest therein with intent to benefit himself or another not entitled thereto. <b>Vandalism</b> - Damaging or defacing school property or the property of school personnel/students (includes criminal mischief)
