Desirable features

High-quality performance is evidenced by:

- deep understanding of one's local culture and another non-English-speaking culture through itineraries that foster mutual appreciation of each other's culture and that reflect similarities in, and differences between, what is valued and what is of interest.
- proficient communication of information (e.g. itineraries and validated costings) in complementary formats (e.g. schedule and spreadsheet respectively) so that details are clear, have been worked out efficiently and are presented effectively.
- succinct and appropriate argumentation to justify individual decisions and recommendations in terms of a stated purpose and situation.

YEARS 4-6

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Acceptable performance (successful task completion) is evidenced by:

• itineraries that incorporate interests of the exchange student.

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• sufficient detail of itineraries and costings in a schedule, spreadsheet and supporting documentation to prove that the itineraries are credible.



Students will design alternative itineraries of interest to a party comprising the student and an exchange student, and to be accompanied by an adult. They will identify a range of issues including transport options, tourist attractions and sites of historical and cultural significance. They will present costings and reasons for their choices.



Ideas, hints and comments

- The intended audience for the itineraries is the accompanying adult.
- It might be useful to treat the exchange student as responsible for all expenses.
- The state/nationwide itinerary could include regional or local elements.
- Different ways of using graphical forms as a means of communicating interrelated information could be explored so that meanings are virtually self-evident.
- The exchange student's areas of interest could be portrayed as the theatre, sport, clubs, architecture or botany.

- Task intensity: medium
- Students must work individually.
- When presenting the itineraries, the student must submit the working documents for his/her itineraries and decisions.
